Three young people are looking for refuge, a place for themselves and their families to live in peace. Separated by decades in time and by oceans in geography, their stories share similar emotional traumas and desperate situations. . . . and, at the end, connect in astounding ways. Josef in 1930s Nazi Germany, Isabel in 1990s Cuba, and Mahmoud in present-day Syria—all three hang on to their hope for a new tomorrow in the face of harrowing dangers.

- 1. Why did Josef, Isabel, and Mahmoud's families leave their homes? How are their situations similar and different? (5-7 sentences)
- 2. Compare the method of travel for each of these refugee families. What are the threats and obstacles faced by each family? How are they similar and different? (5-7 sentences)
- 3. What do you feel is the most important idea or moment in each of these stories? Use a quote from each story to support your argument. (5-7 sentences)
- 4. Which story did you find most powerful, surprising, or interesting? Why? (5-7 sentences)
